Advice to Physicians

This product contains fluoroboric acid giving rise to fluoride ion exposure. Symptoms may be delayed by up to 24 h after exposure. To minimize skin tissue damage, neutralize with antidotes like calcium gluconate jelly, aqueous hyamine, or zyperihaan chloride solutions. To minimize eye damage, treat eyes with a solution of pontocaine hydrochloride. In case of inhalation exposure, it is recommended to put the patient under medical surveillance for 24 to 48 h due to risk of delayed pulmonary edema.

Section 12: Ecological Information

Ecological classifications are based on the IMDG/GHS criteria in conjunction with ecotoxicological data from our suppliers, the European Chemical Agency database (<http://echa.europa.eu>), and other reliable sources.

Thiourea is an acute category 2 environmental toxicant. It is rapidly biodegradable with minimal LC50 of 10 mg/L 96 h for *Danio rerio* (zebra fish); EC50 of ≥ 5.6 mg/L 48 h *Daphnia magna* (water flea); EC50 of 6.8 mg/L 96 h *Desmodesmus subspicatus* (green algae).

Based on available data, fluoroboric acid, tetrafluoroborate, sodium hypophosphite, and boric acid are not classified as environmental hazards according to GHS criteria.

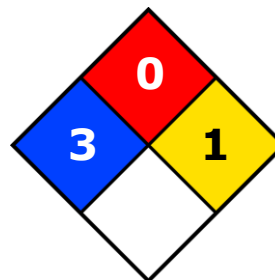
